Asset Based Community Development- Training
















World Breastfeeding Week Awareness – Campaign for Good Health of Mother and Child







On August 7, an awareness program was conducted in collaboration with Navsarjan and over 20 organizations, under the leadership of Dr. Amiben Yagnik. This program, which emphasized significance of breastfeeding, saw participation from more than 130 women, including 44 women from Navsarjan's area of operation. The initiative offered valuable advice for safeguarding the health of both mothers and children.

Kidney Awareness Camp – Early Detection, Better Protection



A kidney awareness camp was held in Laxminarayan Nagar with 32 participants. Free blood pressure and sugar tests were conducted, identifying 8 individuals with high BP and 3 women with high sugar levels. They were referred to doctors for timely treatment.

Adolescent Girls' Health and Wellness Camp

Navsarjan conducted camps in Dastagirnagar, Phulwadi, and Ganeshnagar for 48 adolescent girls. The sessions addressed menstruation, physical and mental health, nutrition, education, marriage, and career planning. Posters and discussions enhanced learning. Mothers appreciated the initiative and encouraged more such camps in the future.



Legal Awareness Camp – Empowering Citizens with Knowledge

Legal awareness camps in Ganeshnagar and Batliboy brought together 54 participants. A legal expert explained how to access legal aid, the importance of property documents, and the validity of rental agreements. The sessions helped citizens become more aware of their legal rights.





Raksha Bandhan Celebration

Raksha Bandhan was celebrated in 8 educational classes to foster unity among children. A total of 254 children, 41 parents, and 10 Mahila Mandal members participated. Activities included festival presentations, thali decoration, rakhi tying, and a shared meal. The children celebrated joyfully, free of discrimination.





















Contractors' Consultation in Surat

A consultation meeting was held for 32 contractors working with laborers in Surat city. Advocate Pratikbhai discussed the Minimum Wages Act-1948, and Sahilbhai, the Project Officer of the Labor Department, elaborated on various schemes for construction workers under the Gujarat Housing and Other Construction Workers' Welfare Board. The session aimed to raise awareness among the contractors and laborers regarding their rights and available opportunities.

Direction to Success for Children - Discussion Session



On 23rd August 2025, a session was held with 25 children residing in the slums of Surat city, led by social worker Heenaben Patel. The children were encouraged to set goals in life, dream big, treat failures as learning opportunities, believe in themselves, and maintain consistency in their efforts. They were motivated to establish long-term goals and fully commit to achieving them.







Health Check-up Camp – Healthy Life, Happy Life













Navsarjan organized a health check-up and awareness camp for 249 children in three different areas of its work zone. The camp provided live demonstrations on healthy eating, body hygiene, limited mobile use, and the harmful effects of addiction. Each child was examined, and necessary medications were provided based on their health concerns.

Rehabilitation of Two Girls for Education



Two girls, aged 13 and 10 years, from the Navsarjan work area, lost their mother and are neglected by their alcoholic father. Their grandmother is mentally unwell. In order to provide them with a better future, with their father's consent and under the leadership of the Women's Forum, these girls have been placed in the Vatsalya Dham Hostel their education for care.

Bhagyalakshmi Credit Co-Operative Society – Financial Support & Growth

This month, the society disbursed 9,15,000 in loans to 13 members for school fees, medical needs, and household expenses, with the addition of 13 new members, the society's strength and reach expanded.

Helping people to get benefits of government schemes - August 2025

In August 2025, Navsarjan guided 297 people on various government schemes, out of which 101 successfully availed benefits.
