Police Station Visit – Building Trust through Dialogue

meaningful towards In step strengthening community-police relationships, 52 women leaders from six Navsarjan areas visited Limbayat Police Station. The aim was to help community leaders understand the police system and build a rapport. The station's in-charge and staff offered a warm welcome and walked them through various departments, including the Crime Branch and FIR filing processes. The visit left the women feeling informed and reassured that the police are allies in their safety and justice.





Kidney Awareness Camp – Early Detection, Better Protection





Navsarjan organized kidney disease awareness camps across Sanjaynagar, Dargah, and Gautamnagar, attended by 86 women and men. Participants learned to identify early signs of kidney-related issues and how to prevent them. Free sugar and blood pressure check-ups were conducted, revealing elevated levels in several individuals—11 with high BP and 10 women with high sugar levels—who were referred for further medical care. The camp sparked vital conversations about health and proactive care.



Legal Awareness Camp – Empowering Citizens with Knowledge

To promote legal literacy, Navsarjan hosted Legal Awareness Camps in Udhna-9, Patelnagar, Hegdevad, and Tanu Awas, drawing 126 participants. A legal expert spoke on accessing legal aid, importance of house documents, and the value of formal rental agreements. The sessions empowered people to stand up for their rights and navigate the legal system with confidence.









Navchetana Meeting - Voices United for Education

At a gathering of 41 Navchetana members, participants discussed pressing local issues, particularly the lack of schools for classes 9 to 12. Together, they decided to submit a formal request to the Municipal Commissioner urging that schools currently running till class 8 be upgraded. A small step that could make a big difference in local youth education.



Bhagyalakshmi Credit Co-Operative Society Ltd. – Financial Support & Growth

In July, the society disbursed ₹4.5 lakhs in loans to 9 members for school fees, medical bills, home-related expenses, and more. The month also welcomed 57 new members, boosting the society's strength and reach. A core committee meeting was held with 30 members, focusing on society regulations and plans to celebrate its foundation day—possibly with a gift distribution.

Parent-Teacher Meetings – Strengthening Partnerships

In all 8 of Navsarjan's active educational initiatives—5 tuition, 2 sewing, and 1 computer class—a total of 148 parents and 25 Mahila Mandal members joined monthly meetings. These sessions focused on students' progress and creating a healthy, open dialogue with parents. The turnout and enthusiasm highlighted strong community involvement in children's development.

Children from classes 1 to 7 confidently shared their thoughts on topics like the importance of trees, social media's effects, fire safety, and their dreams. This platform encouraged children to express themselves, building both confidence and communication skills. Parents were deeply moved by their children's oratory talents.
